High-end hi-fi fans remain firm devotees of LP records, and the best decks are works of art in every sense - consider this before you buy

1 Check your amp

Even when you're spending a lot of money on a hi-fi amp, you can't guarantee it'll have a phono stage to suit a record player. Check it does: if not, you'll need an offboard box

2 Level your rack

If you want to put all your kit on one hi-fi rack, make sure it's level (using a spirit level). Best is to use a dedicated rack just for your deck, with your other kit on another stand

3 Set-up matters

Every turntable needs to be properly set up, and that's especially true of kit in this price class. If you don't know how to do it yourself, get your dealer to do it for you

4 Keep it all clean

We've tested and shot our decks without their dust covers: they tend to look sexier that way. But in the real world, keep it on - a cleaner turntable is a healthier one

5 Servicing helps

Turntables contain a lot of moving parts that can drift out of alignment and suffer from wear over time. A regular tune-up from your dealer is a very worthwhile investment

Clearaudio Performance



IF YOU'RE INTO your aesthetics then the Performance is a winner – it's stylish and sleek, with a milky white finish covering a satisfyingly damped Staron (artificial stone)/aluminium/ fibreboard plinth.

But looks aren't everything. The real heart of the Performance lies in its ceramic/magnetic bearing. This little device uses opposed magnetic fields to remove frictional contact between

bearing shells, making the platter 'float'. It's doubly impressive as this creates virtually no noise, which translates on to the sound produced.

This Performance came with the Satisfy tone-arm and the wooden-bodied Maestro cartridge. Hidden at the side is the motor, a separate unit that fits into a cut-out in the plinth and drives the belt. The motor housing could do with being wider, as it's easy to knock when turning it on or off.

Up there with the best, this Performance doesn't fade with time



We tested the Performance with the complex Straight Street by John Coltrane. Immediately, you notice the level of detail, especially in the treble range. The cymbals crackle, the saxophone reaches out to you, and the bass is particularly well defined. In essence you're listening to exactly what is cut into the grooves – close your eyes and you could be in New York in 1957.

Give the Performance something mellow with close harmonies, such as The Beatles' Yes It Is, and its attention to detail really shines through.

There are quibbles, but only minor ones. This turntable has a distinctive

character in its ability to analyse a recording, and excels in its strong treble and bass reproduction. Sometimes though, its transparency and honest sound mean the midrange loses its sense of projection. Cohesion, too, sometimes feels competent, but no more.

To us, it's a small thing, but that lack of cohesion will niggle some. We still think the Performance is a cracking deck.

moment: let's talk about Mr Nicholas Edward Cave. Along with his band, the Bad Seeds, he created *Nocturama*, one of 2003's great albums. Beautifully produced, it's one of our favourite test records. And most testing of all, is the closing track, *Babe*, *I'm On Fire*. At more than 15 minutes long, it's both an exhausting and an exhilarating listen.

Ambient creates order out of chaos

So what has this all got to do with Clearaudio's Ambient turntable, you ask? Well, played on the majority of hi-fi, Babe, I'm On Fire's rampaging bass, crashing cymbals, lashings of feedback and frantic vocals result in a chaotic soundstage, bass that jumps

around like a toddler on a Sunny D diet, and treble that cuts through week-old Stilton. Not good, in other words.

But play the same track on the Ambient, complete with the £640

Cohesive across all frequencies

From the mass of drums, guitar, percussion and violin, you can pick out each instrument, note and nuance. However, this space isn't at the expense of integration: while the soundstage is wide and deep, the Clearaudio expertly knits together lower, middle and higher frequencies.

Of course, you might not listen to Nick Cave. No matter, this Clearaudio package loves all musical genres:
Orff's Carmina Burana gets the
dynamic reach and impact it truly
deserves, while Christopher and
Raphael Just's Popper 12-inch sounds
more banging than a child with a
hammer and a tin box. Put quite
simply, the Clearaudio Ambient
is just wonderful, whatever it plays.
